




Earth Overshoot Day 1970 - 2020



Pollute our mind and hold us back in our drive for happiness

Sad passions 1: how we are built

- Fear (insecurity, including FOMO)
- Hate
- Envy
- Shame
- Pride
- Comfort



Notable feature: a bit of them is a good thing, provided you actively limit the intensity

Sad forces 2: how we have built our interactions

- Hierarchy
 - Obedience and feedback



- Complexity
 - Simplification is a constant effort*
- Choice (hyperchoice)

The free market as a sad force

- Who/what has no money does not exist
 - Huge social injustice*
- What has no price has no value
 - Huge environmental injustice (sea, bees, etc..)
- What has a price has too much value
 - Salarial divide 1:12→1:300 in 50 years
- Our language has changed to the point of unawareness («petrol producing countries», «social charges»)





Addiction to growth (GDP)

- The indicator drives the performance (no care for long-term: wealth is not expenditure)
- Incapable to obtain without increasing use of matter and energy
- Mantra to avoid redistribution
- An economy that concentrates on the <u>needed</u> and the <u>useful</u> and (<u>some of</u>) the <u>agreeable</u>, suppresses the <u>useless</u> and the <u>noxious</u> sees the GDP go down
 - Planned obsolescence
 - Induced desires (advertisement)

Against the macro-sad forces


- Compensation of externalities associated to economical activities
- Demuneration of capital: pay the CO₂
 intrinsic to it (and force it to emerge from hiding)
- Rationing matter and energy (enthropy)


A Rubik with three hidden faces
